# **EXPLORE** IMMERSIVE LEARNING

## **Exploring Science**

Students of Grade IV embarked on a scientific journey, investigating the solubility and insolubility of substances and sedimentation and decantation through experimentation. They conducted experiments, to learn a new scientific concept and even more importantly to foster curiosity and a love for learning. The scientific approach cultivates a sense of inquiry and encourages discovery, and is an important part of the skill of critical thinking. Grade V students delved into experiments about the properties of air and how it responds to changes in temperature.

HT Dialogues' speaker: Dr. Bhatia on Impact of Global Perspectives in Shaping Teenagers' Worldview

In the context of globalisation, Dr. Bhatia suggested that "Educators always have to be more updated (about global trends) they have always to be on top without looking so, while being collaborative they have to be a lot richer in terms of their own experiences, their own exposure and their own understanding.". She added that teachers who bring purpose and happiness to a campus make all the difference to students, and the importance of "upping the happiness quotient. If a facilitator is a happy facilitator, if a teacher is a happy one he/she is able to percolate that happiness down to the learner."

She highlighted that "we are not interconnected, we are interwoven into the fabric of a global society and language", and stressed that such integration is a rich asset.
