ON WHAT CHANGE MEANS

We teach our children about change that occurs in our attitudes, change in our lifestyles, **change in our belief ystems** to be more inclusive, to be more cohesive, to be more positive, to look at everything beyond our own canvas, factoring in the needs, feelings & relevance of others as well.

ON CHANGE IN EDUCATION

If we can blend each capability and bring out a more well-rounded child in the campus, a teacher who is not only teaching content but is able to **open up a larger perspective** – we are creating change. If we are doing Hindi, if I am doing kadamb ka ped, how does the fruit look? What kind of leaves does it have? The poem kadamb ka ped was written around Yamuna ke teere - what kind of water exists in Yamuna? If my Hindi teacher can bring in that perspective in a Hindi classroom, we take our learning into a **meaningful coexistence**. We're the changemakers that society needs.

ON CHANGE AS OUR SCHOOL PHILOSOPHY

Our role as changemakers in education means that if we want change, it serves no purpose unless it reaches and touches the children. So we keep the **change**, **growth & evolution of every child above every priority** & work in a focused way to lead thoughts & actions that touch the lives of our students.

ON CHANGEMAKERS

Change is written on the wall. If we become part of the change, if we become the changemakers, if we become ambassadors of the need for change and become good role models for others to emulate, I think we do justice to our presence. If (there is) mere presence and it is not taken to a direction where it lends to a meaningful purpose, it doesn't justify what we are talking about right now. The justification also lies in our capability to take it forward not only with few, not only with many, not with most but with everyone.


PARENT-TEACHER MEETINGS

Lighting up Creativity in Classrooms

Creativity is a state of mind that is rich in ideas and possibilities. A fascinating world of original thinking lies within and behind the word. Creativity is about being curious, observing, connecting dots and asking questions; it is about thinking laterally and imaginatively before finding new solutions and new value—beit at the individual or community level.

The development of creative minds at KIIT World School is one of the most desirable outcomes of education and is based on four key pillars of our creativity & innovation curriculum:

- Creative empowerment in academics: Creative learning calls for moving away from learning by rote/memorisation to teaching that leads to discovery and exploration. This rests on original approaches in academic learning right from telling students to solve a math problem in a way other than the one that has been taught, to legacy projects that take up and solve a complex community problem.
- Teacher mindsets that go beyond certainty & comfort zones: Fostering creativity can take teachers beyond their primary role of guiding students towards a designed, structured outcome within timelines. As students explore and engage with new ideas, lesson plans must be more flexible often navigating 'why' questions and new approaches while balancing curricular requirements. R. A. Beghetto in Creative Learning in Education (2021) speaks of "curricular space necessary for students to make creative contributions". So too, we empower teachers to plan for uncertainty within defined frameworks.

- Safe haven classroom environment: A safe environment that allows for risk-taking is the minimum criterion for creativity to flourish. Failure is a natural part of creative behaviour and is taken at face value by nurturing teachers, encouraging peers and social ecosystems. Creativity in classrooms calls for trust so that students put out their personal, authentic self during creative exercises.
- The "whole-being" approach: Physical, emotional and intellectual immersion when the 'whole child' is engaged in a learning experience takes creativity to its peak. New and original ideas flow from a child who is physically and emotionally fit and operates from a spring of wellness. It is these feelings of wellbeing that are the true secret of building confidence and developing creative energy.

The student is seen as a co-creator of the creative learning experience at our school along with the teachers. As Einstein said, "A society's competitive advantage will come not from how well its schools teach multiplication and periodic tables, but from how well they stimulate imagination and creativity."


